LETR Puck Drop:

It was another great event for the PEI Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics. On December 9th, the fundraising team hosted a Puck drop during the Charlottetown Islanders hockey game that raised over \$500! Colton Matheson, kings county powerlifting and golf athlete, also lead the singing of O Canada. The Torch Run is an international initiative that began in 1981 when a run between Topeka and Kansas City raised over \$15,000 in support of Special Olympics. Since that time, the Torch Run has spread to over 20 countries involving over 50,000 law enforcement officers from a variety of policing agencies, raising over \$7 million worldwide. In PEI, every year law enforcement personnel from across the province take to the highways for a series of annual fundraisers, such as the Puck Drop, that benefit Special Olympics PEI. Their next event will be the annual Polar Plunge that will happen in April 2018!
