2015 Special Olympics BC Winter Games welcome sponsors

The athletes will be competing in the seven SOBC winter sports: alpine skiing, cross-country skiing, curling, figure skating, floor hockey, snowshoeing, and speed skating.

The curling, figure skating, and speed skating events will be hosted at McArthur Island Sports and Events Centre, and floor hockey events will be held in School District #73 schools. The alpine skiing, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing events will be hosted at Sun Peaks Resort. The Games will kick off with the Opening Ceremony on the evening of February 19 at the Tournament Capital Centre, where all the teams will get to march in proudly and be welcomed to Kamloops.

"At Provincial Games, I meet lots of new friends, and I feel proud because I worked so hard for it. It's a different and great experience," says SOBC – Kamloops curler Megan Gourley, who is getting ready to compete with her team in the 2015 SOBC Winter Games. "It's so exciting to compete in Provincial Games here in my hometown. I've never done that before. I hope lots of people will come out to volunteer with the events and cheer us on!"

About the 2015 Special Olympics BC Winter Games

The 2015 SOBC Winter Games, set be held on February 19 to 21 next year, will feature 600 athletes from around the province going for gold in alpine skiing, cross-country skiing, curling, figure skating, floor hockey, snowshoeing, and speed skating. SOBC athletes province-wide competed in Regional Qualifiers last season to qualify for coveted spots in the 2015 Provincial Games. In Kamloops, athletes will compete for the chance to advance to the 2016 Special Olympics Canada Winter Games in Corner Brook, Newfoundland, where the participants will seek to qualify for the 2017 Special Olympics World Winter Games in Austria.
