in Regina for Special Olympics. The trophy is given each year for the athlete running the fastest 100 metres at the provincial games.

Lorraine Beauchene from Zone 6 and Jerry Anderson from Zone 8 won the George Reed trophy. The trophies were donated by the famous number 34 of the Saskatchewan Roughriders, George Reed, the honorary head coach of the Special Olympics Society and honorary chairman of the Special Olympics provincial games. The trophies are presented each year to the top male and female athletes.

Two special presentations were made by to Heather of Estevan (zone 1) for being the top female bowler and to Robert Tarko of Zone 2 as the top male bowler.

Helen Serhan of Zone 8 was presented the Knights of Columbus trophy. The trophy was donated by the Langevin chapter and it goes to the best athlete in their first year of competition.

Terry Lingstone of Zone 2 won

the Giesginer trophy. It was donated in 1977 by Mrs. Giesinger and is presented annually to the top swimmer as determined by the swimming meet director.

Zone 7 was the winner of the Schick trophy. The trophy was donated by Mrs. Schick in 1970

and is presented annually to the team finishing first in the 200 metre mixed relay race.

Zone 8 captured the Times-Herald trophy. The trophy was donated in 1979 by the Moose Jaw newspaper and presented to the zone accumulating the most points.
