

Funds recommended

A number of local groups were recommended by city council to receive a trust initiative program (TIP) grant this coming year. Final approval will come from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Foundation.

A total of \$30,000 in funding was requested but not everyone was successful. The total allocation will be \$10,057.78.

Some of the organizations that were rejected were either referred to the region, because of limited funds, and were told to apply in September; or they were not within the index of needs.

The Estevan National Exhibition Centre will receive \$440.40 for programming and \$369.92 for an art workshop; the Youth Activities Council \$400 for a youth spring fling; Estevan Archery Club, \$500 for a 3D shoot; Estevan Flying Club, \$1,000 to assist with promotion of the Estevan Air Show; Estevan Golden Eels Swim Club, \$565 for introduction to speed swim; Estevan Writers' Group, \$526.96 for its Bridging the Gap program; the Estevan Tourism Committee, \$1,000 for promotion for the Antique Car Club and the Rum Run; Estevan Exhibition Association, \$380 for a literary art competition; Zone 1 Special Olympics, \$300 for certification of coaches; and Stars for Saskatchewan, \$519.50, Trio Mio program.

Estevan Youth Soccer will receive two separate grants, one of \$225 for a referees' clinic and the other for \$300 for a coaching clinic; Estevan Arts Council, \$400 for outdoor art experience; Saskatchewan Spina Bifida Association, \$800 for wheelchair sports; Estevan Diversified Services, \$156 for a games in the park program; Estevan Track and Field Club, \$200 for a coach's

clinic and training; Estevan men's and ladies' fastball, \$775 for ball clinics; Estevan Figure Skating Club, two grants with \$300 for a

summer skating school and \$200 for a CanSkate clinic; and Estevan Parks and Recreation, \$700 for a health promotion showcase.
