



R.C.M.P. REPORT Lumsden Detachment

On May 28th, 1993 a resident of Lumsden reported some damage to his backyard. His garden and a tricycle were damaged while they were away for the day.

On May 30th a resident of Regina Beach reported finding a bicycle. Described as a Sears Free Spirit, 12 speed, 26", grey in color.

On May 31st a resident of Buena Vista reported that someone had attempted to break in to her cottage. Nothing was taken.

On May 31st a resident of Regina Beach reported damage to seven street signs. None were stolen but all were knocked down by the culprits.

On June 6th a resident of Buena Vista reported the theft of gas from her school bus.

On June 7th a resident of Lumsden reported damage to his irrigation pipes.

On June 12th a small fishing boat was recovered in Lumsden. No owner has been identified.

During the past two weeks several reports of vehicles being entered and items stolen from them have been reported in Regina Beach. In most instances the vehicles were left unlocked and some even had the keys in the ignition. Residents are requested to lock their vehicles and ensure keys are not left in the vehicle. Any items of value should not be left in plain view. If left in the vehicle, they should be locked in the trunk or glove compartment. Any suspicious activity or persons should

be reported to our office. Items stolen from the vehicles, such as wallets, purses, briefcases, etc. are often found strewn about the street. If located they should be safeguarded for fingerprint examination and reported to this office.
