Team selections for the 1994 Saskatchewan Winter Games are fast approaching. Throughout November, December and early January, 223 athletes, coaches and managers will be selected to represent S.E. Saskatchewan in Kindersley from February 13 to 19. The kick off to our team selections will be at the Zone I Multi Sport Camp, November 11 to 13. In addition to beginner and advanced clinics, there will be Talent Identification and/or Team Selection in Badminton, Speedskating, Gymnastics and Special "O" Speedskating (Estevan); Bowling and Special "O" Bowling (Weyburn); and Wrestling (Indian Head). Each sport is organized by volunteer Sport Chairperson, with the clinics conducted by qualified Coaching Clinicians.

In December: Team selection for Volleyball will be held December 12 in Estevan and our Curling Team (both male and female) will be selected at Zone I Bonspiel in Radville, from December 17 to 19. Ringette play-offs will also be held in early December.

January will see us select our Cross Country Ski Team January 9 at White Butte, and our Downhill Ski Team January 14, 15, 16, at Ochapowace Ski Resort.
