The eight Zone Sport Councils of Saskatchewan are responsible for administering the Theory component of the National Coaching Certification Program. In 1992, Saskatchewan communities hosted: 65 Level I courses, 22 Level II courses and 3 Level III courses, certifying 1,447 participants in their respective Theory Levels. Since the beginning of the N.C.C.P. program over 25,000 coaches have been certified throughout Saskatchewan. Zone 1 offered 6 Level I courses and 1 Level II course in 1992.

Are you interested in hosting a Level I or II THEORY course in your community? Hosting an N.C.C.P. Theory Course is a very simple task, that will deliver long lasting benefits to the quality of coaching offered to athletes in your community. Hosting requirements are minimal: book the facility, promotion locally, collect registration fees, and ensure that the course is filled (min. 10 / max. 25 participants). The Zone 1 Sports Council will: deliver all course materials, provide the course instructor, promote throughout the zone, and provide 100% of instructor fees and expenses. The Zone 1 Sports Council is now setting the N.C.C.P. Theory Course Spring Schedule, contact the Zone 1 sports Council if you are interested in offering a N.C.C.P. Level I or II course in your community.

You're going to find two Shaquille O'Neal cards in 1992-93 NBA Hoops Series 2.

O'Neal, who is tearing up the NBA with the Orlando Magic, has a regular card (No. 442), and he's also featured (card No. 1 of 10) in Magic's Rookie Team, a 10-card insert set.

Series 2 features more than 40 rookies, including Alonzo Mourning and Christian Laettner.

Also featured are two other limited-edition insert sets — The Supreme Court and More Magic.

Here's a rundown: Series 2 totals 140 cards — player updates (rookies, trades, etc.), 130; NBA Hoops trivia, 5; NBA Stay in School, 1; NBA Inside Stuff, 1; Checklists, 2; and, Rookie Checklist, 1.

Insert sets total 26 cards — Supreme Court (featuring NBA stars from Michael Jordan to David Robinson to Magic Johnson), 10; Magic's All-Rookie Team, 10; More Magic, 3; Patrick Ewing Art Card, 1; John Stockton Ultimate Game (he has autographed 1,633 cards one for each of his steals going into this season), 1; and, NBA Hoops Chicago Bulls championship card, 1.
