

# Special games on next week

More than 1,500 persons from across Canada, including a contingent of 30 from Saskatchewan, are expected to take part in the Canadian Special Olympics scheduled for the University of Manitoba next Thursday to Sunday.

The Canadian Special Olympics are an annual athletic event organized for the mentally handicapped over the age of 13 years.

A floor hockey tournament, organized and sponsored by the National Hockey League, will be held in conjunction with the Special Olympics at the Dutton Arena in St. John's Ravenscourt School.

Jim Daly, chairman of the Olympic committee, said that the emphasis in the 1974 Games, the third to be held in Canada, will be on personal improvement and involvement.

He predicted that 20,000 ribbons will be handed out so that "everyone has a chance to go home with something tangible as evidence of his participations and his accomplishments."

Ribbons will be presented for participation, and each

athlete will get one for just finishing the event.

There will be 11 basic events, six in track and field and five in swimming. Track events include the 220- and 60-yard dash, high jump, standing broad jump, ball throw and joggers' mile run. Swimming events include the 50-, 25- and 200-yard freestyle and the 25- and 50-yard backstroke.

Twelve periphery events include equestrian, archery, roller skating, gymnastics, horseshoes, music, dance, drama, floor hockey, golf and painting and crafts.
