

SPECIAL OLYMPICS BC - 5 Pin Bowling Criteria for Sanctioning of Competition

RULES - EXCEPTIONS TO THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS CANADA, (SOC) RULES.

Exceptions to the SOC rules. Please note that these rule exceptions only apply to Local, Regional and where noted, Provincial Games. Athletes and Coaches must be aware that all competitions outside the above would be governed by SOC rules and the rules of that Sport's Governing Body.

- 1. If a 5 Pin Bowling team that is moving from Regional to Provincial qualifiers must replace an athlete on that team, the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules will be used for that substitution. Only 2 substitutions may be made to any team and the athlete must have the same average, within a 10-point drop of the athlete they are replacing. They must be from the same Region.
- 2. At the Local, Regional and Provincial levels of 5 Pin Bowling, the results should be Pins over Average. Also teams must move after each game.
- 3. For registration, all Bowling coaches will include a Bowling Lane's computer printout of, or have the Bowling Lanes sign a copy of, the Bowlers official averages with every tournament registration form.

DIVISIONING

In accordance with the Special Olympics Canada Official Rules for 5 Pin Bowling, tournaments are to be divisioned based on gender and ability solely, age of participants is not to be considered.

FACILITY

The facility must meet all required specifications as they read in the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rulebook

The lanes used for competition must have a current season Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Regulation Bowling Lane Certificate, posted in the establishment - C5PBA Rule 6.a.1

In addition to the facility requirements detailed by the Canadian 5 Pin Bowling Association the following should be kept in mind when securing an appropriate facility:

- Access to washroom facilities for Male and Female participants
- Separate changing facilities for Male and Female participants
- Fully accessible to all participants, i.e. participants with a physical disability.

SPORT OFFICIALS

Host communities must identify a Head Official prior to making their application for sanctioning to the Provincial Office of Special Olympics BC. For assistance in recruiting individuals appropriate for these roles please contact the SOBC Provincial Office.



Please note - In accordance with the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association, (C5PBA) Rule 23 - Automatic Scoring Devices that have been approved by the C5PBA Standards and Specifications Committee may be used in sanctioned league or tournament competition. If Automatics Scoring Devices are to be utilized, tournament organizers should attempt to have a full complement of scorers to augment the Automatic Scoring Devices should a discrepancy occur.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

The following are the minimum requirements for medical coverage at sanctioned Special Olympics BC 5 Pin Bowling competition.

• Four (4) First Aid attendants - (standard certification)

Special Olympics Canada Official Sport Rules

Five-Pin Bowling Rules

The Special Olympics Canada (SOC) Official Sports Rules shall govern all SOC 5-Pin Bowling competitions. As a national sport program SOC has created these rules based upon the Canadian 5-Pin Bowling Associations' (CFPBA) rules for 5-Pin Bowling competitions. CFPBA rules shall be employed except when they are in conflict with the SOC Official Sports Rules. In such cases, the following sections outlining the SOC Official 5-Pin Bowling Rules shall apply.

SECTION A

Official Events

1. Singles Competition

2. Team Competition (a team consists of five participants).

SECTION B

Rules Of Competition

- 1. At National Games, the match play system used by the CFPBA shall be utilized.
- 2. Five pin bowling events shall be divisioned by ability rather than age.
- 3. All of the bowling events shall consist of either an all male team, all female team or a co-ed* team.

*NOTE: A co-ed category is allowed in the Team competition only when there is an insufficient number of one gender to make either an all male or all female bowling team(s). If there are not enough co-ed teams in the Team competition to constitute a division, then that co-ed team(s) shall compete in the men's division.

- 4. For National Games, participants must submit the results from the Provincial level competition plus their current season's average.
- 5. The current season's average must be supported by an official League Record Sheet certified by the coach, instructor and/or proprietor.
- 6. The current season's average must be determined at a club and/or house level based upon a minimum of twenty-five (25) games.
- 7. Entry averages for athletes competing at a National Games will be selected from either the qualifying average submitted for the Provincial level competition, or from the athlete's current League Average, which ever average is higher.
- 8. At National Games, only participants, coaches and officials will be allowed in the

bowling area. The "bowling area" shall be defined as the bowling lane, the scoring table, and the adjacent seating area for the competing participant(s), and as defined by the Tournament Committee.

- 9. An individual with a visual impairment may have coaches give them pre-delivery assistance. The coach and/or instructor may properly align the athlete, but cannot assist in the delivery of the ball.
- 10. At National Games, participants shall play a minimum of two (2) and a maximum of three (3) games per day throughout the regulation tournament format plus finals.
- 11. All athletes and coaches must be dressed uniformly and in proper bowling attire. Such attire includes a collared shirt, pants with a straight hemmed bottom . Denim, sweat pants, stir-up pants, spandex and hats shall not be permitted.
