

SPECIAL OLYMPICS BC - Curling Criteria for Sanctioning of Competition

RULES - EXCEPTIONS TO THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS CANADA, (SOC) RULES.

Please note that these rule exceptions only apply to Local, Regional and were noted, Provincial Games. Athletes and Coaches must be aware that all competitions outside of the above will be governed by SOC rules and the rules of that Sport's Governing Body.

- 1. A regulation game shall consist of a maximum of six (6) ends. Game time will be two (2) hours in length with no new end to begin after two (2) hours.
- 2. One (1) three (3) minute break will be given at the end of three (3) ends.
- 3. Scorekeepers must have coaches sign score sheets at the end of each game in a tournament. The director of the tournament play will oversee all on-ice officials, timekeepers and scorekeepers at the competition. This will ensure that both teams agree upon score before the score is made final. Once the score sheet is signed a protest cannot proceed.

DIVISIONING

Due to the facility and time restrictions often faced at a Regional Qualifier the following divisioning procedure is suggested.

- 1. Local Coaches are required to complete the pre-competition questionnaire and submit it to the Competition Coordinator 30 days prior to the start of the competition.
- 2. Teams are to be divisioned into preliminary divisions based on the information presented on the teams' questionnaire.
- 3. Teams will be required to play a maximum of two (2) divisioning games before the start of the competition.
 - Divisioning games are to be conducted under the rules and regulations as they appear in the Special Olympics Canada Official Rules Book.
- 4. Following the divisioning round teams are to be divisioned according to the Special Olympics Canada Official Divisioning Process.

FACILITY

The competition venue should comply with the requirements dictated in The Rules of Curling - The Canadian Curling Associations Official Rule Book.

In addition to the venue requirements listed in the SOC Official Rules Book participants should also have access to the following facility amenities

- Access to washroom facilities for Male and Female participants
- Separate changing facilities for Male and Female participants



• Fully accessible to all participants, i.e. participants with a physical disability.

SPORT OFFICIALS

All on-ice officials must be at least Level One (1) certified under the Canadian Curling Association certification program. The Head Official must be in place before applying for sanctioning from the SOBC Provincial Office.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

The following are the minimum requirements for medical coverage at a Curling competition.

■ Two (2) First Aid attendants - (standard certification)

Curling

The Special Olympics Canada (SOC) Official Sports Rules shall govern all SOC curling competitions. As a national sports program, SOC has created these rules based upon the World Curling Federation (WCF) and the Canadian Curling Association (CCA) rules for curling competitions. WCF and CCA rules shall be employed except when they are in conflict with the SOC Official Sports Rules. In such cases, the following SOC official Curling sport rules shall apply.

SECTION B

Rules Of Competition

- 1. A classification (seeding) round shall be conducted to place teams in a division.
- 2. In the classification (seeding) round, teams shall play 2 or more ends. Each team will be required to play all players whose names appear on the *final team roster*.
- 3. Team formation is not subject to a given male/female ration and teams may also be made of exclusively males or females.
- 4. A *final team roster** shall consist of 5 players and two coaches. All players listed on the *final team roster* shall have an opportunity to play during the course of the tournament.
 - *NOTE: A final team roster is a complete list of all players and coaches registered with the team.
- 5. Coaches will not be permitted on the ice during play. Coaches may only be permitted on the ice during the 3 minute break.
- 6. A regulation game shall consist of a maximum of 8 ends. The duration of the game shall be 2 hours in length. If the 2 hour time limit has expired, the curlers shall finish the end that they are playing. No end shall be started after 1 hour and 50 minutes.
- 7. One 3 minute break shall be given upon completion of 4 ends of play.

- 8. A mercy rule shall be imposed if, after six full ends of play, one team leads another by ten points or more, the game will be called.
- 9. One referee per sheet of ice per game shall be appointed. This individual shall monitor the flow of play, record the official score, and measure rocks.

SECTION C

Equipment, Attire and Safety Requirements

Individual curlers on the respective team must have matching on-ice apparel. Such apparel may include matching pants, jacket and golf shirt. Teams are not required to wear their provincial/territorial colours as noted in **The Rules of Curling, Official Rule Book,** of the Canadian Curling Association.

The use of a curling aid commonly referred to as a delivery stick which enables the player to deliver a stone without placing a hand on the handle is considered acceptable for Special Olympics Competition.
