Regina Rams win Sask Sport Award

The Regina Rams Football Club of the Prairie Junior Football Conference have been named Sask Sport's athlete of the month for November.

The Rams capped an undefeated season by winning the Canadian junior football championship with a 23-11 triumph over the Hamilton Hurricanes. The victory marked the Rams' 11th national championship since 1966.

Besides winning the national title, team members Todd Fuchs and Tim McFadden were selected all-Canadians, while Frank McCrystal was named Canadian junior football coach of the year. The November award included Tania Jones of Saskatoon, a member of the Canadian relay team; Warren Muzika, a linebacker with the Saskatoon Hilltops of the PJFC; Regina's Dawn Birley in tae kwon do; Ian Gordon, goaltender for Swift Current Broncos of the Western Hockey League; and Canadian Special Olympics powerlifter Jim Wingert of Regina.

Janes sets two provincial swim marks

Rikki Janes of the Saskatoon Goldfins Swim Club set two provincial records en route to recording seven first-place finishes in the 13-14 girls' age group competition at the Prairie Winter Invitational swim meet at Winnipeg which concluded Sunday.

Janes set a provincial record of one minute, 5.11 seconds in the 100-metre backstroke and a mark of 2:17.39 in the 200 back competition.

Janes also recorded first-place finishes in the 50 and 100 free-style, 100 butterfly and 200 and 400 individual medley events.
