The Zone 5 Sports Council has announced plans for the 1993-94 season, with a look ahead to the Saskatchewan Winter Games.

Both Alpine and Cross Country skiing will be part of the 1994 Sask. Winter Games. To be eligible to participate in Alpine, competitors must be a Saski Club member, National Card Holder and be born in 1975 through to 1982. There will be three classes of competition held during the second half of the games (Feb. 16 - 19, 1994).

Competitors in cross country skiing must hold a Sask. or Canadian Racing License and be a member in good standing of a club member of the Sask. Ski Association. There are three age classifications for boys and girls, including Midget (13 and under), Juvenile (15 and under), and Junior (17 and under).

Special Olympic competitors must be 29 and under as of Sept. 1, 1993, with one man and one woman comprising the Zone 5 team.

For both alpine and cross country skiing, six men and six women, plus one coach and one manager, respectively, will make

up the Zone 5 team.

In 1990, the Zone 5 women's volleyball team, represented by athletes from Beechy, Lucky Lake, Outlook and Lumsden, placed first in the Sask. Winter Games in Melville.

In 1994, Zone 5 hopes to match that finish.

The rules of eligibility for men's and women's volleyball include:

- Athletes must be born in 1977 or later.
- After qualifying as a zone winner, a team may add up to a maximum of three players within the Zone to a maximum of 12 team players. No original registered team members shall be dropped.

- All coaches must be fully certified Level I and must be registered in Arima Challenge.

Intent to register and fees are due by Oct. 31 and final player registration by Dec. 1, 1993. For more information on men's or women's volleyball, contact the Zone 5 office at 682-2741.
